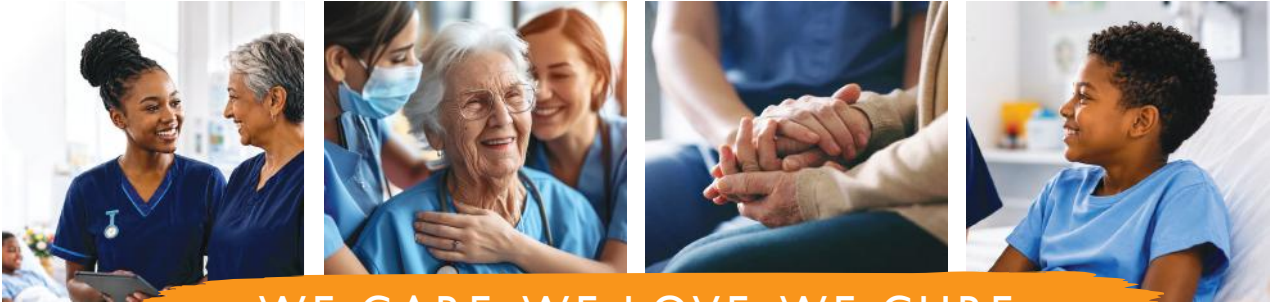

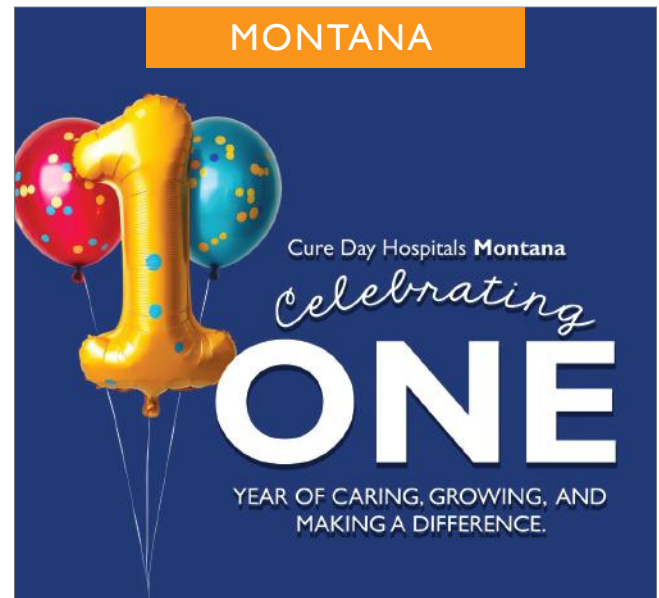

Orthopaedic CPD Function

Cure Day Hospitals Erasmuskloof recently hosted a well-attended CPD function. Dr Jaco Naude and Derik du Toit, both Fellowship trained orthopaedic surgeons, shared specialized insight regarding 1) traumatic Lisfranc and midfoot injuries and 2) traumatic ankle ligament injuries.

A Lisfranc injury is damage to the bones, ligaments, or cartilage in the middle of your foot (midfoot). It ranges from simple ligament sprain to complex bone fractures and joint dislocations. If missed or improperly treated, it can lead to chronic pain, arch collapse, and permanent arthritis. Traumatic ankle ligament injuries occur when the ligaments stabilizing the joint are stretched or torn due to a sudden twist or force. Proper management is essential to prevent chronic pain and joint instability.

Building Skills That Matter

Cure Day Hospitals offers a range of accredited learnerships across multiple disciplines, including:

- Business Administration
- Bookkeeping
- Marketing
- End-User Computing

These programmes span NQF Levels 2 to 5 and are accredited through recognised bodies such as SETA and the QCTO, ensuring learners gain quality, industry-aligned qualifications.

Creating Opportunities for South African Youth.

The programme primarily targets unemployed youth, while also offering development opportunities to existing employees. This inclusive approach ensures both new entrants and current staff benefit from career growth pathways.

When I started as a Stock Controller Assistant Intern, I supported the team with inventory management, including stock counts, reconciling physical stock with system records, verifying deliveries, maintaining accurate data, and assisting with audits. I gradually took on more responsibility as I proved reliable. The most important skills I developed were attention to detail, computer proficiency, and problem-solving. Accuracy became essential, as even small errors could cause major discrepancies, and I learned to use inventory systems effectively to improve overall stock accuracy.

Annual intake targets typically range between 35 and 40 learners, reflecting Cure's ongoing commitment to skills development.

The programme consistently delivers strong outcomes:

- 90% - 95% completion rate.
- 98% of learners placed at Cure Day Hospital's facilities secure permanent employment.

This success highlights the programme's effectiveness in preparing learners for real-world roles while strengthening Cure's talent pipeline.

Developing Talent from Within

Learners are supported throughout their journey by:

- Dedicated managers.
- Mentors and colleagues.
- Accredited training facilitators.

Through coaching, mentoring, and hands-on experience, learners develop both technical expertise and essential workplace skills.

It begins with finding your purpose: what drives you, what inspires you and what keeps you committed even on the most challenging days.

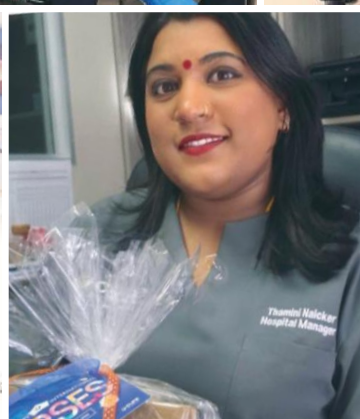
Employees can empower themselves through continuous learning and professional development ensuring their knowledge and skills remain relevant in an ever-evolving healthcare system.

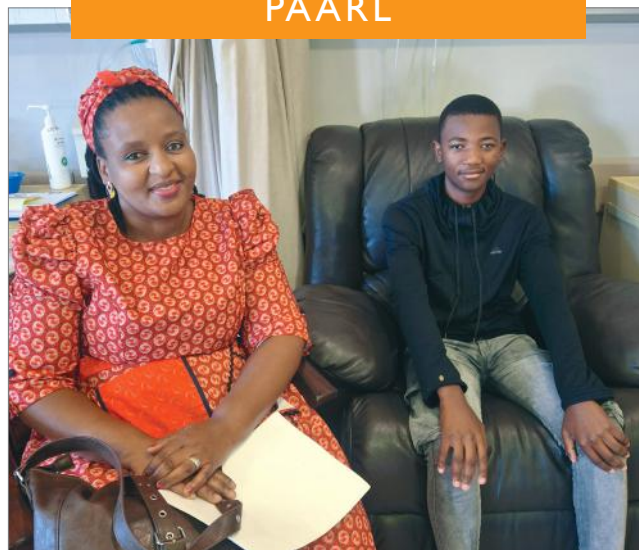
